Australia v Pakistan in Tests at the MCG

Pakistan came into being following partition of the Indian sub-continent in 1947. Pakistan was divided into two parts: East and West Pakistan. West Pakistan broke away in 1971 to become **Bangladesh.** Pakistan played its first Test match in October, 1952 against India at Delhi, losing by an innings and 70 runs. Bangladesh played its first Test match in November, 2000 also against India at Dhaka, losing by nine wickets.

At MCG, December 26-30, 2016: **PAKISTAN 443** (126.3 overs) (Azhar Ali 205*, Sohail Khan 65, Asad Shafiq 50; JR Hazelwood 3/50, JM Bird 3/113) **and 163** (53.2 overs) (Azhar Ali 43, Sarfraz Ahmed 43; MA Starc 4/36, NM Lyon 3/33) **were defeated by AUSTRALIA 8/624 dec**. (SPD Smith 165*, DA Warner 144, Usman Khawaja 97, MA Starc 84, PSP Handscomb 54; Sohail Khan 3/131, Yasir Shah 3/207) **by an innings and 18 runs.** *Man of the Match*: Steve Smith

Australia went into this match having won the first of the three-Test series in Brisbane by 39 runs after setting the visitors 490 to win. Captain Steve Smith won the toss and sent Pakistan into bat. As a result of interruptions from inclement weather the visitors were still batting into the third day with over 140 overs being lost. Opener Ali's 205 run-anchor lasting 580 minutes contrasted with his fellow batters; only Shafiq (50) from the upper order providing real support while Sohail Khan (65 including four sixes) hit lustily near innings end. Hazlewood (3/50 from 32.3 overs) was best with the ball. The Australians batted in superior conditions; not losing their fifth wicket until they drew near to level with their opposition. Warner (144 from 143 balls) recorded his first MCG century and was partnered by the elegant Khawaja (97) while 198 were added for the second wicket. Smith then took control and was undefeated (165) at the end of the innings. He was supported by Handscomb (54) and when the sixth wicket fell the home team was ten runs ahead of Pakistan's total. Starc then joined Smith and a further 154 runs were added; Starc hitting 84 from 91 balls including seven sixes. Pakistan began its second innings before lunch on the final day and were dismissed for 163 from 53.2 overs; Azhar Ali and Sarfraz Ahmed top scoring on 43 while Starc and Lyon took seven wickets between them.
