- 4.3. A child ticket may only be purchased if the person is within the age range specified in relation to the ticket, the relevant age of a person is taken as at the date the ticket is presented for entry and not the date of purchase. An Authorised Person may require evidence of the person's age or make a reasonable assessment.
- 4.4. Patrons under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult.
- 4.5. Patrons agree to be searched (including, without limitation, their bags, clothes or other possessions) upon entry to the MCG and while inside the MCG. The MCC reserves the right to inspect and search any patron's bags, regardless of size. This may include visually or physically inspecting the bag and/or seeking the patron's assistance to remove items from the bag. The MCC also reserves the right to conduct 'pat down', 'wanding' or other reasonably personal checks of the patron as they enter or exit the MCG.
- 4.6. If patrons are required to provide personal information (as defined by the Victorian *Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014* (Vic) (**Privacy Act**)), the MCC will at all times deal with that Personal Information in accordance with the Privacy Act and the MCC's Privacy Policy, which can be accessed on the MCC's website. The MCC's Privacy Policy sets out details about the third parties to whom we share information, how you can seek access or correction of your Personal Information, and how to make a complaint about the MCC's handling of Personal Information. In some circumstances, you will not be able to access the MCG if you do not give your consent to collect or handle certain personal information, including in relation to surveillance camera use, body worn camera use and facial recognition technology, as set out in clause 3 above.
- 4.7. Patrons consent to the MCC, its commercial partners, governing bodies or responsible suppliers or entities for events held at the MCG or other venues and any relevant third party service providers using the patron's Personal Information in connection with investigating, documenting and analysing any possible breach of these conditions of entry, equivalent conditions from a governing body or responsible entity, or the law.
- 4.8. Patrons agree, without prejudice to any other rights which the MCC may have, that if a patron contravenes any of these conditions of entry they may (having regard to the circumstances and nature of the contravention):
 - 4.8.1. be refused entry to the MCG;
 - 4.8.2. be required by an Authorised Person to provider their name, address, photograph, MCC membership card (if applicable) and other relevant Personal Information;
 - 4.8.3. be ejected from the MCG by an Authorised Person;
 - 4.8.4. have their ticket confiscated and/or cancelled without refund or recompense; and / or

	4.8.5. be prohibited and disqualified, by means of an MCG Official Banning Notice, from purchasing tickets for and/or entering the MCG for future events for a period of time as determined by the MCC in accordance with its disciplinary procedures.

		appropriate clothing and footwear, sun protection and hydration.
		7.4. Patrons are admitted to the MCG at their own risk.
		7.5. Patrons should be mindful that seats retract automatically. Patrons need to check their seat before sitting down.
