

BIG BASH LEAGUEMELBOURNE STARS V SYDNEY THUNDERJANUARY 25 2023LIBRARY FACT SHEET

Introduction

The Big Bash League (BBL) was established in Australia in the season 2011-12 (BBL01) with the same eight teams that presently exist. Initially the teams played each other once during the season (28 matches) prior to there being two semi-finals and a final. Over the years the number of matches per season has been progressively increased and from the 2019-20 season (BBL09) each team has played the seven others twice; a 56-match home and away series. The same season also saw the introduction of the final five and the playing of The Eliminator, The Qualifier, The Knock-Out, The Challenger and The Final.

Based on performance in the BBL to date the teams playing this evening's match present an interesting comparison:

- The Stars, after the first 11 seasons of the tournament (BBLs 01-11), have won 52.0% of matches played; exceeded only by the Scorchers and the Sixers. The Thunder's winning percentage of 41.1 is the lowest.
- The Stars have played in the finals in eight of the 11 seasons to date compared to the Thunder's four; three of which have featured the expanded final series. Notwithstanding, the Thunder has recorded a tournament win (BBL05) while the Stars have yet to do so.
- The Stars' three wins from 12 in finals matches (25%) is well below its 52.0% winning rate in all matches played. In comparison the two most successful teams in finals, the Scorchers and the Sixers have won 64.7% and 66.7% of finals matches respectively.
- The Perth Scorchers have won four finals and the Sydney Sixers three while the Thunder (one final win) is joined by the Strikers, Heat and Renegades leaving the Stars and the Hurricanes yet to break through.
