# 2024/25 ONE-DAY CUP VICTORIA V WESTERN AUSTRALIA

## The Australian One-Day Domestic (ODD) Tournament: A Brief History

Domestic limited overs cricket commenced in Australia in the 1969/70 season. The six Australian states and New Zealand (which entered at the semi-final stage) participated in a 40 eight-ball overs per innings knock-out tournament. New Zealand withdrew at the end of the 1974/75 season. In 1978/79 Australian cricket embraced the six-ball over format in all forms of the game and 50 six-ball overs per innings was introduced to the ODD tournament.

From time-to-time additional teams have competed in the tournament. A team representing the Australian Capital Territory competed in the seasons from 1997/98 to 1999/00 inclusive while a Cricket Australia team competed between 2015/16 and 2017/18.

The most successful state is Western Australia with 17 wins followed by New South Wales (12), Queensland (10), Victoria (6), Tasmania (4), and South Australia (3). The remaining three wins were by New Zealand in 1969/70, 1972/73 and 1974/75. In its three seasons in the tournament the ACT won only three matches. A Cricket Australia team competed during seasons 2015/16 to 2017/18, winning only two matches during that period.

Victoria's six wins came in 1971/72, 1979/80, 1994/95, 1998/99, 2010/11 and 2018/19. Victoria has also been runner-up on ten occasions, namely: 1969/70, 1976/77, 1985/86, 1988/89, 1992/93, 2006/07, 2007/08, 2008/09, 2009/10 and 2012/13. Western Australia's 17 wins were: 1970/71, 1973/74, 1976/77, 1977/78, 1982/83, 1985/86, 1989/90, 1990/91, 1996/97, 1999/00, 2003/04, 2014/15, 2017/18, 2019/20, 2021/22, 2022/23, 2023/24. Western Australia's 11 runners-up were 1974/75, 1975/76, 1978/79, 1980/81, 1983/84, 1991/92, 1993/94, 1995/96, 2000/01, 2002/03 and 2020/21.
